Cooperative Arts and Humanities Students in The Gallery@Haskins

NEW HAVEN, CT—Haskins Laboratories will present “Explorations of the Mind,” an exhibit showcasing the works of several members of the junior and senior classes of the new Cooperative Arts and Humanities High School. The show focuses on the figure or the environment, as observed and then interpreted. The mind of each student-artist explores new ways to look at his or her chosen subject for the creation of the work on display.

The exhibit will run from April 3 to April 17, 2009 with an opening reception to be held on Friday, April 3, from 5 to 7 pm in the Gallery@Haskins, 300 George Street, Suite 900.

The show will be curated entirely by Co-op students and feature the works of Delilah Koppelman, Kyle Langlan, April Lewis, Amber Ochoa, Jade Streater, Nick Nodiff, Maria Korchagina, Timothy McClure, Danielle Moffett, Bryanna Robertson, Giovanni Rivera, and Symphony Spell.

The Gallery@Haskins is an unconventional exhibition space provided by Haskins Laboratories to engage new audiences while providing unique opportunities for artists to display their talents.

Haskins continues its exploration with this very special exhibition by the young artists from Co-op, a 2009 Silver Medal winner of the Best High Schools in the U. S. News and World Report annual analysis. This event coincides with the official March 28 dedication ceremony of Cooperative Arts and Humanities at its new location at 177 College Street in downtown New Haven. The new state-of-the-art facility designed by world-renown architect Cesar Pelli, is one of only two full-time creative performing arts high schools in Connecticut. The new 140,000 square foot building boasts a 350-seat theatre, black box theatre, scene shop, dance studios, 2D and 3D arts studios, video production studio, choral and instrumental rehearsal space, photography lab, gym, library, cafeteria, and eventually will phase in professional performance venues, as well.

The reception and exhibit are free and open to the public.
